ACC Attendance Policy and Expectations

- Each CM is allowed <u>ONE</u> absence per year for professional development events (this includes ACCs).
- Absences must be requested at least 1 month in advance of the event. If you need to request an absence, email me and I will let you know next steps. Emergencies happen. If you have an emergency, just let me know!
- Two tardies are equivalent to <u>ONE</u> absence. No matter the reason for being late, it will still count as a tardy; that's why you get two. Even if you let me know that you will be late, I do not have the ability to "excuse" you.
- If you arrive late (read: after the designated start time), it is a tardy, regardless of whether the sessions have actually begun or not.
- If you leave early without prior permission, it will count as an unexcused absence.

As a region, we are held to strict compliance guidelines with AmeriCorps that are based on the number of hours of service that each CM must complete. We must be able to show that every CM completes the required amount of hours in order for our entire region to receive Ameri-Corps funding.

Real Time Coaching Sign-Ups


Anna is preparing to start Cycle 2 of Real Time Coaching! This cycle is open to anyone looking to push their teaching skills to AWESOME! The time commitment is minimal, but the pay-off is amazing!

The Real Time Coaching cycle framework looks something like this:

- Cycle 1: 20 minute pre-conference, 20 minute coaching session, 20 minute post-conference
- Cycle 2: 10 minute pre-conference, 20 minute coaching session, 20 minute post-conference
- Cycles 3-Final Cycle: Same as cycle 2.


Real Time Coaching typically lasts between 3 and 7 cycles and is designed to help you rapidly improve in the area of classroom management and culture, regardless of where you start.
